EARTHQUAKE SHAKES SEATTLE

No fatalities, but several injured reported after incident.

A powerful earthquake rattled Seattle late evening two weeks ago, leaving damage and injuries in its wake. Authorities say the quake’s central point of origin appears to have been the southern Puyallup area, though the exact epicenter has not yet been confirmed.

The tremor sent tremors through buildings across the city, with reports of collapsed walls, fallen ceilings, and extensive damage to commercial and residential structures. Emergency responders assessed multiple incidents, including gas leaks and downed power lines. Residents are still advised to stay away from the damaged buildings until approved by

appropriate authorities. Geologists warn that aftershocks are still possible over the next week. Standard measures for mild earthquakes can be taken at this time as they believe these would only be the result of the land settling once again.

Officials said the southern Puyallup region is the likely origin point based on preliminary data, but teams are continuing to map the quake’s precise epicenter. Some roads are just now opening post clean-up, and other transit services have been reinstated. Authorities are still asking for residents to remain apprised of any further closures or updates.

DR RUBY HARRISON TO LECTURE AT UW

Lecture about the uses of technology and magic.

A forthcoming lecture of the uses of technology and magic will bring together two leading researchers from different universities across two nations. Professor Ruby Harrison of the University of Nevada, NAN, is set to present a talk at the University of Washington's School of Magic, hosted by UW professor Teremun Amari, UCAS.

The event will examine the theoretical applications and uses of technological advances and how it could intersect in magical practices, possible ethical considerations, and implications of combining the two

disciplines in the future.

Harrison, renowned for her work at the University of Nevada, will join Amari, a respected figure in the UW School of Magic, for a collaboration that organizers say highlights the growing convergence of science and mysticism. The lecture will cover case studies where attempts of technology augmenting magical practice and the arcane pushing into technology. They encourage all students, faculty, and guests to ask questions after the presentation.

"This collaboration is about pushing the boundaries of what we consider

possible when technology and magic inform one another," Amari said. "We hope attendees leave with a clearer sense of both the promises and the responsibilities that come with the possible future of integrating these fields." Harrison added, "Technology provides new lenses for understanding magical phenomena, and magic offers a creative framework for rethinking technological impact."

The talk is open to students, faculty, and members of the public. Organizers say the session aims to foster dialogue between science-based methodologies and arcane studies, highlighting a growing interest at the intersection of technology and magic. Shiawase Aquisition

Bicson Biomedical now under new ownership.

Shiawase Corporation announced today that it has agreed to acquire Bicson Biomedical in a move to secure sole ownership of their innovative research portfolio. Terms of the deal were not disclosed. Industry analysts noted that the deal could reduce redundancy in research pipelines and accelerate the pace of development.

COUCILWOMAN RUMORED FOUND

University of Washington rally allegedly draws out the missing councilmember, Amber Hestaby.

A council member from Tir Tairngire who has been missing for a few years was reportedly seen among attendees of UW’s rally yesterday. The rally was an opportunity to celebrate the community’s investment in higher education and campus development. The project, a flagship expansion intended to be a dorm for their awakened students, is slated to be completed by mid-December.

Tir Tairngire’s missing persons unit has been notified and issued a brief statement saying investigators are reviewing security footage from the rally and interviewing attendees who may have seen the council member in

the crowd. A spokesperson for their municipal office stressed that there is no publicly released information had been released and that additional confirmations would come only from official channels. The Seattle-area law enforcement said they would continue to coordinate with the council office to verify whether the sighting has any relevance to this event.

As the UW project moves toward its close, investigators say any information from the public could prove crucial. People with tips are asked to contact the Tir Tairngire missing persons unit or Seattle law enforcement.

This year's races could be something to watch, even for the non-fan, as UCAS is top contender for prime drivers. Heath may have been the favorite at the start of the circuit, but Smythe has come in hot and fast. Is UCAS lined up to break the 100-year streak? Will we finally get to see Smythe?

The Art of Racing

Newcomer Archibald Smythe made sensational debut in this year's Fall racing circuit, stunning fans and rivals alike with a performance that skipped past the competition and instantly positioned him as the driver to beat. SECURITY OFFICERS OFFER AID

University of Washington calls on security to evaluate new facility.

The University of Washington has requested a comprehensive security assessment of the newly established dormitory intended for students with magical abilities. President Lexi Barber has commissioned a team dedicated to evaluating the security protocols for the students' safety.

A statement released last Tuesday said the evaluation aims to identify and mitigate potential risks associated with the dormitory. The initiative reflects ongoing efforts to balance inclusivity with campus safety standards across all student housing.

Campus sources indicated that this comes as part of a broader safety review of living spaces that could

intersect with non-traditional or experimental student programs. Details about the layout, access controls, surveillance measures, and emergency response protocols were not disclosed, but administrators emphasized that the assessment will be thorough and privacy-conscious.

Devin Coffey, Ares Macrotechnology Security and head of this evaluation team, states, "We are coordinating with university officials to conduct a rigorous evaluation. Our goal is to ensure residents have a secure environment for practicing magic."

Barber confirmed that suggested changes would be implemented in line with university policies.

OYOKAWA STILL AT LARGE

Suspect of financial crimes against Renraku now fugitive.

Authorities are seeking the fugitive, Oyokaya, who fled the city amid ongoing manhunt operations. Officials say he is believed to have crossed national borders and may be in another country, though no confirmed destination has been established.

The fugitive is highly connected to a technomancer who may have aided in his escape and possibly circumvent border guards. Knights Errant has begun seeking additional resources for international cooperation to search.

The case remains under active investigation, investigators reviewing security footage, financial records, and digital footprints to establish Oyokawa's current whereabouts. Charges for embezzlement and financial fraud have been filed against Oyokawa and his accomplice who has yet to be named.

SHIAWASE SUFFERS LOSS OF PERSONNEL SPECIALIST

Raging fire and shots fired, leaving three dead.

A local personnel specialist with Shiawase was found dead following a street altercation. The incident, which unfolded a few weeks ago, prompted a heavy law enforcement response and an ongoing investigation. The specialist, Katie Paulsen, along with her two others were targeted at a small intersection between two back streets. Emergency responders arrived at the scene and found all three unresponsive. The county medical examiner has performed an autopsy and determined the cause of death as gunshots to the head and fire.

Ms. Paulsen was known for her services in workforce placement and security staffing in Shiawase. A company spokesman released a brief statement expressing their condolences to the families of all three victims and confirmed they are cooperating with authorities as the investigation proceeds.

Officials have not released the names of the other individuals involved or specific suspects. Investigators are reviewing surveillance footage from nearby businesses and interviewing possible

witnesses to establish a timeline of events and to determine whether the altercation was connected to the victim's professional duties or other factors.

Seattle's Mayor released a statement urging calm and assuring the public that law enforcement is actively pursuing leads. "We are coordinating with Knights Errant to ensure a thorough and transparent investigation," the statement read.

At this time, no arrests have been announced, and investigators have not released a preliminary motive. Those who work and live in the area expressed shock at the violence, emphasizing the importance of safety and community support. Anyone with information related to this incident are encouraged to come forward and contact the precinct or submit tips anonymously.

Further updates are expected as investigators collect evidence and interview additional witnesses. The case remains under active investigation and officials have pledged to provide information as it becomes available.

INVESTIGATION UNCOVERS TECHNOMANCER

Embezzlement investigation uncovers potential technomancer operating unchecked in Seattle.

The ongoing investigation into the embezzlement of funds from Renraku took a dramatic turn today, with Oyokawa revealing knowledge of a technomancer operating in Seattle. During intensive questions, Oyokawa admitted awareness of the individual but refused to disclose their identity, citing unspecified reasons.

Investigators believe the embezzlement scheme, which siphoned significant sums of money through several shell corporations, involved an accomplice outside of Renraku's employee roster. Sources close to the investigation suggest this partner benefitted directly from the illicitly obtained funds.

"While we've made significant progress in tracing the flow of money, identifying the technomancer is crucial to understanding the full scope of this operation," stated Alan Bech, CEO of Renraku Security. "Their skills could have been instrumental in facilitating the embezzlement and potentially concealing the funds further."

The investigation is now focusing on identifying the Seattle-based technomancer. The refusal of Oyokawa to cooperate in revealing the technomancer's identity is proving a significant hurdle. Law enforcement is exploring all avenues to compel his cooperation and unravel this intricate web of financial crime.

BODY FROM LAKE IDENTIFIED

Body found in Lake Sammamish identified as drug runner.

Authorities have confirmed that the body discovered is Jose Rodriguez, a known drug runner. The official cause of death is still under investigation but is believed to be linked to escalating territorial disputes between rival kingpins in the area.

Rodriguez was reportedly a key

player in moving product from the Seattle area into the eastern suburbs. The investigation is now focused on identifying potential rivals and unraveling the complex web of the local drug trade. The incident underscores the growing concerns about the escalating violence.

ARES SECURITY OFFICER DEAD

Internal investigations have begun after incident.

Three suspects are in custody following the brazen robbery at Felix’s Event Center, Downtown on July 13th. While arrests have been made, only a portion of the stolen property has been recovered. Details regarding the nature of the stolen items are being withheld pending the ongoing investigation.

Knight Errant, the top-rated law enforcement agency, is still actively searching for the white van believed to be used in the getaway. According to witnesses, the van was cleverly disguised as a vehicle belonging to one of the event’s catering companies.

“According to our suspects, we may be looking for a secondary team. If anyone has further information, we strongly urge them to come forward,” Sr. Officer Ramirez announced last evening.

University of Washington begins project for new dorm in September.

ONE IN CUSTODY, THREE AT LARGE

Three at large after robbery at Felix's Event Center.

A daring robbery at Felix's Event Center yesterday evening resulted in one arrest, while three suspects remain at large. The suspects made off with an undisclosed number of valuables before fleeing the scene in what was initially believed to be a catering van.

According to preliminary reports, the four suspects forced their way into the building around 7:30 PM. Knights Errant, responded swiftly to an alarm triggered at the location and apprehended one individual at the scene who was transported immediately to Seattle Hospital for treatment and questioning.

An immediate search was launched for the vehicle, but authorities have yet

to locate it. In a twist to the investigation, Regina Delafosse, owner of Le Belle Cuisine Noir, a local catering company, contacted authorities stating, "All of our vehicles are accounted for and have not been compromised. We are fully cooperating with the investigation and will follow up with any additional information found."

The investigation is ongoing and Knight Errant are actively pursuing leads to apprehend the remaining suspects. Anyone with information is urged to come forward. Authorities also wish to warn the public, all suspects should be considered armed and dangerous.

OYOKAWA UNDER ARREST

Renraku Contract Sales Manager arrested for embezzlement.

Kamata Oyokawa, formerly a high-ranking manager within Renraku contract sales department, is in Knight Errant's custody following the discovery of significant financial discrepancies. He is being held on suspicion of embezzling a substantial sum from the megacorporation over an extended period. The investigation

began after an internal audit showing anomalies which traced back to his department. "Renraku takes matters of corporate malfeasance extremely seriously and are confident that justice will be served," a spokesperson stated. The case is expected to be long and complicated as Renraku's internal operations may come under scrutiny.

After a month-long investigation, authorities have finally released names of the two individuals who tragically lost their lives in a street fight that occurred June 10th. SR 542 PILE-UP

Multiple injuries following accident on SR 542.

STREET FIGHT LEAVES TWO DEAD

Two dead, multiple injured in street fight, property damage reported.

A violent street fight erupted late Saturday night in downtown Seattle, resulting in the tragic deaths of two individuals and significant property damage. The brawl, which involved multiple participants, took place around 11:00 PM near the intersection of Pike Street and 2nd Ave, an area known for a bustling nightlife.

Witnesses reported chaotic scenes as fists flew and objects were hurled during the confrontation. Doc Wagons were quickly dispatched to the scene, where they found two men, aged 27 and 31, dead on sight.

Local businesses nearby were caught in the crossfire, with several

stores sustaining damage from the shattered glass and debris. "It was terrifying," said Jessica Thompson, a bartender at a nearby establishment. "We heard screaming and then saw people fighting. It all happened so fast."

Knights Errant are investigating the incident and have urged anyone with information or trideo footage to come forward. The identities of the deceased are being withheld pending the investigation. Residents are encouraged to stay vigilant and report any suspicious activity to the authorities.
